# Here's the latest news and updates from our beloved Corvette community.

GM dealer Rick Hendrick pays \$3.7 Million to own the first C8 Corvette ZR1. The black and blue ZR1 is reported to have a top speed of 233 mph. If you have a desire to own one of the few ZR1's scheduled for production, you can get in line now with select Chevrolet dealers.

Otherwise, if you are interested in a new 2024 or 2025 C8 Stingray, Z06 or E-Ray, the inventory of new Corvettes for sale in the United States looks favorable. According to the Chevrolet Live Inventory Tracker, on January 8, 2025, these are the following inventories of C8's at all dealers combined across the United States.

2025 models – 3,842 2024 models – 1,600 Corvette Stingrays – 4,135 Corvette Z06's – 933 Corvette E-Rays – 374
