Participation from members was strong, and the entertainment was well received. The band was described as excellent, and members expressed appreciation for both the music and overall atmosphere. During our February Corvettes of the Bay meeting, Greg Rohde reviewed the build statistics for the 2025 model year Corvette. A total of 25,835 Corvettes were built in the 2025 model year. Here is the model breakdown:

Some interesting breakdowns:

- Stingrays remain the most popular at 13,640 (52.8%) of all 2025 Corvettes
- Z06 is second most popular with 8,862 (34.3%)
- E-Ray is 3,153 (12.2%)
- ZR1 is 180 (0.7%)
- Convertibles are almost half of the cars built at 43.2%
- Track packages – Z06 with Z07 accounted for 1,805 (20.4%) of all Z06 builds
- ZR1's are rare – 180 total with almost half (46.1%) with the ZTK Performance Package

1996 Chevrolet Corvette Collector's Edition

Dan Terrien was putting the pedal down before he was old enough for a pedal car! By the time he was 4 years old, Dan was riding shotgun in his Uncle Dale's '64 Sting Ray making routine trips to local car shows. Further influenced by his Aunt Cora's '67 Vette, it was inevitable that Dan's destiny was spelled C-O-R-V-E-T-T-E. His first was a 1977 C3 in 2003 followed by an upgrade to a '92 and then Christmas came early in December 2015 in the form of this special 1996 Collector's Edition Corvette. Of the 5,412 Collector's Editions produced, this is 1 of just 1,540 Collector's Edition coupes equipped with the slick-shifting 6-speed ZF manual and powered by the one-year-only 330-horsepower LT4 monster version of the 5.7-liter V-8.

Dan's C4 wears Sebring Silver, which was exclusively reserved for the Collector's Edition, but the rest of this Corvette is pure platinum. Benefiting from the expertise of his close friend and fellow Corvettes of the Bay member Doug Cohen, and Dan's son Hunter, this trio created the Swiss Army knife of sports cars. From the suspension to the stereo, every inch of this Corvette has been tweaked and tuned to make it a candidate for the most dependable, highly maintained original Corvette in existence. That durability was on display in 2025 when Dan completed all 1800 miles of the grueling Hot Rod Power Tour. Dan still hasn't decided if this will be his "forever Corvette" but he's gone to great lengths to make sure it is built to last forever!
